





Our offices relocated to 3 Landmark Centre this year!

Lincoln is Ready to Move Forward


At the beginning of 2015, LPED engaged Angelou Economics (AE) of Austin, TX to develop strategic recommendations to make Lincoln a globally competitive city. After extensive community engagement, research of best practices of successful communities, the strategic plan was created and rolled out to the community at the LPED annual breakfast on June 30.

The new Vision Plan details goals, strategies and actions for Lincoln to pursue that account for the community's challenges, and leverages assets that will best secure Lincoln's economic future. Angelou Economics recommended the community should focus on three broad, over arching strategic objectives:

- Develop world class workforce, recruit talent and infrastructure
- Nurture a globally competitive entrepreneurial ecosystem
- Strengthen collaboration among key economic assets

Today is the day to get involved in your community!

Once the Angelou Economics strategic objectives were established, LPED created three working taskforces in the areas of opportunity from AE's report: workforce, infrastructure and entrepreneurial development. The taskforce goals were to examine the recommendations and produce a Lincoln-specific plan of action. The three taskforces completed the majority of their work in December and have presented their recommendations to the Lincoln Chamber Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors. Recent Project Announcements/Expansions

A significant number of expansions across several industry sectors continue to drive the job market in Lincoln. Eleven existing companies in Lincoln publicly reported expansions this year, outpacing the publicly reported primary jobs created in all of 2014. The Lincoln metro area had a record 191,900 people employed in October 2015 – 4,500 more than the previous year.

Hour of Code is a tremendous success! 500 people of all ages learned to code

More than 500 people of all ages learned the basics of coding through self-guided tutorials at the Nebraska Innovation Campus Hour of Code event held during National Computer Science Week. There was also an interactive tech fair, which allowed the families to get a hands-on experience with robots and wearable technology.

The one-hour introduction to computer science was designed to demystify "code" and show that anyone can learn the basics to become a maker, a creator and an innovator. The need for software developers and computer engineers is increasing. People who struggle with math are quick to shy away from coding. According to Code.org, there are more than 604,000 open computing jobs nationwide. And last year, only 38,175 computer science students graduated into the workforce.




Miracle Meters:

The cars are judged in a series of static and dynamic events, including technical inspection, cost, design, solo performance trials and high performance endurance. The 2016 competition expects even more participation from around the world. As the competition grows, so do the benefits to our community. This international event draws hundreds of visitors to our hotels, restaurants and local businesses while promoting Lincoln as a mainstay in the automotive events industry.

NORCECA Women's Olympic **Qualification Tournament** January 7 - 9
