LIMOUSINES

GETTING AROUND

With a few exceptions, Lincoln's major arterials are laid out in a simple grid. Numbered streets run north to south and in the older sections of town, lettered streets run east to west. O Street is the north-south dividing line. The downtown district follows the grid system, too. Many downtown streets are one-way.

TRAFFIC LAWS

Speed limits: 25 mph unless otherwise posted. Fines double for speeding in school zones and construction zones.

Turns on red: Unless otherwise posted, right turns are permitted on red lights – after a full stop. Left turns on red are allowed when turning from a one-way street onto another one-way street.

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Seat belts: For any vehicle driven in Nebraska, use is required of the driver and all front-seat passengers, as well as anyone under the age of 18 wherever they are seated in the vehicle. Children less than 6 years of age must use a correctly installed approved child safety seat system.

U-turns: Generally permitted at arterial intersections, unless otherwise posted.

Motorcycles: Operators and passengers must wear DOT approved helmets.

PARKING

Downtown: Approximately 23,000 spaces in metered, on-street or in parking lots/garages are available for general public use daily.

FIRST HOUR FREE! Find a space in a Park & Go city garage where your first hour is free. First floor shopper zones are available for your convenience. Parking and towing restrictions are enforced. Parking information is available at www.parkandgo.org.

Elsewhere: Free, off-street parking is convenient to most shopping, dining and business areas. On-street parking is free in residential districts.

Fees: On-street metered spaces, with time limits ranging from 10 minutes to 10 hours, are \$1 per hour. Parking meters are not monitored on Sundays and after 6 pm all other days. Public facility fees are \$1 per hour, with a maximum of \$9 for all-day parking.

Variability is the only constant when it comes to weather in Lincoln. There is a 148-degree spread between the city's record high of 115 degrees (July 25, 1936) and its record low of 33 below (Jan. 12, 1974).

Lincoln's average temperature for the entire year is 51 degrees.

Hottest month: July (average daily temperature, 78.2 degrees)

Coldest month: January (average daily temperature, 21.3 degrees)

Annual Precipitation: 28.3 inches

Annual snowfall: 26.3 inches

For assistance during unusual weather, or for road conditions, listen to local radio stations KFOR (1240 AM) or KLIN (1400 AM) and local TV stations KOLN (Channel 10/11) or KLKN (Channel 8).

A winter storm, thunderstorm or tornado warning means threatening weather is about to take place and people in the watch area should seek shelter.

The Nebraska State Patrol offers a recording describing road conditions throughout the state: Call 511.

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
The Cube





The State Capitol has been a constant in the lives of Nebraskans since it first towered over Lincoln, fondly thought of as the capital on the edge of the prairie. The Capitol Building is the perfect place to begin your tour of Lincoln's attractions and learn Nebraska's story. The interior of this must-see jewel tells Nebraska's history through carvings, mosaics, paintings, sculpture, inscriptions and inlaid wood. Each artistic element contributes to the symbolic concept of this gem, voted one of the 10 most beautiful buildings in the world by a group of 100 architects. Constructed between 1922-1932, Nebraskans are proud that it was paid for when it was built at a cost just under \$10 million. Designated a National Historic Landmark in October 1976, it is home to the only non-partisan one-house legislature in the United States.

LINCOLN STATUE CC-4

The Lincoln Monument at the west entrance of the Nebraska State Capitol was created by sculptor Daniel Chester French and architect Henry Bacon ten years prior to their Lincoln Memorial on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. Dedicated at this location on September 2, 1912, Nebraska's Lincoln Monument was commissioned to celebrate the centennial of President Abraham Lincoln's birth and includes the Gettysburg Address inscribed in granite.

RAIL JOINER STATUE BB-4

by Louis Slobodkin

The original plan for the Capitol included the broad avenues that lead in all directions of the building. Facing the west entrance of the Capitol at the opposite end of Lincoln Mall is a bronze statue of a young Abraham Lincoln. "The Rail Joiner" welcomes visitors to the Justice and Law Enforcement Center at 575 S. 10th Street. The original was sculpted by Louis Slobodkin, completed in the 1930's and is displayed at the Department of the Interior in Washington D.C. The Sheldon Museum of Art received a plaster cast of the sculpture and the right to reproduce it.

State Capitol BUILDING

At 15 stories and 400 feet (121 m) tall, it is the second-tallest U.S. statehouse. It is the tallest building in Lincoln, and the third-tallest in the state. It is the heaviest building in Lincoln, as well as the heaviest capitol building of any sort in North America. There is an observation deck at 250 feet (76 m).

A community-wide effort, including a "Pennies for Lincoln" campaign by Lincoln school children, funded the placement of the statue.

Located in the heart of downtown Lincoln, Nebraska's Centennial Mall is one of the most frequently photographed and most recognized public places in the state. Countless citizens visit the seven-block public space that connects the State Capitol to the University of Nebraska. Built in 1967 to commemorate the state's centennial anniversary. Nebraska's Centennial Mall has functioned as a gathering area and rallying point for many different historic events and occasions. The mall is currently under restoration and redesign. When completed, Centennial Mall will celebrate the state's natural and cultural heritage. provide durable, accessible walkways and flexible spaces to accommodate a wide variety of activities and uses. Major features include the Capitol Fountain and Plaza featuring the Great Seal of the State of Nebraska, the Nebraska Plaza and Missouri River Fountain, the Platte River and Ogallala Aquifer plaza area and the Sparking the Good Life Fountain and Plaza.

Located west of Memorial Stadium and within a couple blocks of Nebraska's shared professional/college baseball stadium, the exhibit is in its first phase and features a Wall of Honorees for the Hall of Fame's golden and silver anniversary teams, plus Fischer Family Award winners, Gustafson Inspiration Award winners, Dominate Dynasties and Great Moments in High School Sports. Located inside the Nebraska School Activities Association office building, take advantage of the free entrance while the Hall continues to work on phase 2 of a project that will honor individual athletes, coaches, officials and key contributors to the rich heritage of Nebraska high school athletics.

Along with the overall concept of water, each block has a more specific focus relating to nature and the essence of water. The O to P streets block focuses on natural ecological systems, which are seen through the themes for the murals installed on the retaining walls, as well as the pavement patterns which represent the dry stream beds that would have been present before Lincoln was established. The P to Q streets block has a community focus. The Jayne Snyder Trails Center provides amenities for trail users, space for public gatherings, restroom facilities and the 200 person Dickinson Dinsmore Graf Amphitheater. Murals between these two city blocks focus on community including Native American tribes and pioneers that settled in this area. Lastly, the Q to R streets block focuses on the flora and fauna of Nebraska. An overlook is located on the south side in the shape of an inverted vortex. It offers views along the channel as well as to the city, truly capturing the fact that Lincoln is an urban forest. The Assurity Overlook is planted to show the juxtaposition of native and agricultural plant material and includes bioretention cells that collect and clean the storm water runoff.

Great restaurants, unique shopping and fun nightspots located among restored turn-of-the-century warehouses make this area sizzle with activity. Antique shops, art galleries and the first microbrewery in Nebraska draw visitors day and night. The Historic Haymarket name comes from the original market square of 1867 where wagons, camping equipment and hay were bought and sold. In 1874 the city shifted the area a few blocks west and north and renamed it "Haymarket."

The spirit of the 1800's flows into Bill Harris Iron Horse Park located on the north side of the historic Burlington Northern Railroad depot. A threedimensional brick mural, "Iron Horse Legacy," shows old locomotive Number 710 pulling the first train into Lincoln in 1870 on July 4th. A railroad themed children's play area, offer visitors a respite from the bustle of the city.

The Nature Center, in the southwest corner of the park, features eight miles of walking trails through native Nebraska prairie grasses, woodlands and wetlands. A herd of bison, elk, white-tailed deer, wild turkey, hawks and owls are exhibited in their natural Nebraska habitat along the Nature Center trails. The Chet Ager Building has animals and exhibits depicting woodland and wetland habitats. Surrounding the Nature Center Buildings are an herb garden, children's garden, bird garden and prairie gardens. The Thomas Hudson Cabin, built in 1863 is the "oldest dwelling in Lancaster County" and the Depression Era District 113 Cunningham School, known as the Heritage School. This one room school house is where Lincoln Public School 4th grade students attends school for a day to learn about the daily lives of Nebraska Pioneers. 

Gambling

Legal forms of gambling in Nebraska range from Keno and pickle cards to horse racing and bingo, to state lotteries and Powerball. Generally, you must be 19 years old to gamble, but 18-year-olds can buy pickle cards and play bingo.

Keno is played by picking up to 20 numbers and placing bets in multiples of \$1. Twenty numbers are drawn from a total of 80. Winnings depend on the bet and how many of your numbers match the numbers drawn. Big Red Keno's main site is Big Red Keno Sports Bar and Grill at 955 W O Street, 402-434-7777, but games are offered through a televised computer link-up at a variety of Lincoln locations.

BINGO

Several local non-profit groups offer bingo games. Cost per card generally ranges from \$5 to \$25, and games pay \$50 to \$75 in prizes, plus a sizeable jackpot.

Pickle cards are sold at night spots and liquor stores throughout the city for 25 cents to \$1 each, generally with a portion of the proceeds benefiting non-profit groups. Payoffs available immediately from the seller, range from 25 cents to \$1.000 dollars.

LOTTERY

The Nebraska Lottery sells Scratch and Lotto tickets through a retailer network of more than 1,200 locations statewide, ranging from convenience stores to supermarkets and from service stations to cafes. Tickets may not be sold in establishments licensed for consumption of alcohol on premises. Players must be at least 19 years old.

Nebraska Lottery retailers pay prizes up to \$500, but amounts above this must be redeemed at one of six claim centers. Prizes above \$20,000 must be redeemed at Nebraska Lottery Headquarters in Lincoln. For more information, visit the Nebraska Lottery on the web at www.nelottery.com or call 402-471-6100.

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Which came first, the chicken or the egg?

That age-old philosophical question could also be asked about Lincoln, Nebraska's burgeoning food scene. Which came first, an amazing gourmet menu, sourced from farms just minutes away from the restaurant. Or, an ever-increasing and sophisticated dining public that is forgoing chain restaurants and who appreciate food prepared thoughtfully and enjoyed slowly?

Those who have followed the rise of the Capital City's food and drink culture the past few years may have different perspectives on whether patrons or chefs led the charge, but make no mistake – everyone agrees, Lincoln's dining scene is most definitely on the move.

There are several new restaurants popping up that have an emphasis on locally sourced food and are catering to an extremely wide taste palate -Sebastian's Table, a Spanish tapas restaurant; Jack & June, an "Urban Table" focusing on modern tastes and local roots; and The Normandy, specializing in traditional French cuisine and pastries. They join the existing favorites like bread&cup, Parthenon, Dish, Greta's Gourmet, Single Barrel and others.

These restaurants and their chefs have taken calculated risks in preparing menus that push the traditional appetite of Midwestern diners. They are meeting the increased demand of diners who are very knowledgeable about their food and where it comes from. While we do not have the space here to include everyone, the list of chefs who are working collaboratively, leaving their culinary egos in the freezer and changing the way Lincoln diners approach food is impressive: Kevin Shinn, Eric Leyden, Brandon Harpster, Erik Hustad, Scott Burkle, Kevin Mandigo, Kyle Lamb, Lorin Dagle, George Kazas and Travis Green. According to the US Department of Agriculture, "local food or the local food movement is a collaborative effort to build more locally based, self-reliant food economies - where sustainable food production, processing, distribution, and consumption is combined to enhance the economic, environmental and social health of a particular place."

People who are driving the trend to understand where their food comes from and who prefer to eat locally grown/produced food are sometimes called "locavores." They understand that the food prepared by our all-star chefs is only as good as the supply from which it is sourced. Lincoln chefs are finding outstanding quality LOCAVORES products such as pork from Travis Dunekacke of TD Niche Pork in Elk Creek, Nebraska and naturally raised chicken EAT LOCAL from Dean Dvorak of Plum Creek Farm. They are also finding fresh organic food grown by Robinette Farm in Denton, Sanders Farm in Dwight and Common Good Farm in

Ceresco. Branched Oak Farm in Raymond specializes in artisan cheese from their herd of grass fed cows.





Celebrating Lincoln's food culture

What evidence do we have that Lincoln's food scene is indeed on the rise? Lincoln Secret Supper, a social media and word-of-mouth driven entertainment club, was created in October 2011. Their goal was to get people out of the normal "go out to eat at our favorite restaurant" habit and discover a whole new world of dining, at the same time emphasizing meeting new friends and having conversation around a shared community table. LSS members do not know where they are dining, what they are eating or even who they will be dining with. The culinary experiment was met with enthusiasm and excitement, quickly growing to over 3,000 members competing for 50 seats at the Community Table every other month.

In partnership with the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce, Lincoln Convention and Visitors Bureau, Pinnacle Bank Arena, and a variety of food related sponsors, LSS created "Farm Food Fork, Celebrating the Rise of Lincoln's Culinary Culture." Featuring 12 local chefs, 7 local bartenders and the chance to be one of the very first through the doors of the brand new arena, was enough to get most any food enthusiast excited. To up the ante, LSS convinced Travel Channel's globetrotting celebrity chef, Andrew Zimmern, to also join the party.

Over 250 eager food enthusiasts enjoyed appetizers Pork & Lamb Terrine followed by a 4-course meal with Plum Creek Farms Roasted Free Range Chicken Galantine; Shadowbrook Farms Mixed Greens; Cider Brined TD Niche Pork; Nebraska Star Wagyu Beef Strip; and Basil Infused White Chocolate Mousse. The event gained the attention of food and travel writers who came from New York City, Milwaukee and Des Moines to see what all the food fuss was about in Lincoln, Nebraska. All were impressed to find an oasis of culinary excellence.

No matter the Genesis, chef or customer, Lincoln, Nebraska is firmly planted on the culinary map. Great meals await those willing to get out of their comfort zones and join the local food movement. *Cheers!*
