

2017 City Council Candidate Questionnaire

- 1). As a member of the Lincoln City Council it will be your responsibility to prioritize spending tax dollars between departments, programs, and services.
 - What is your top priority for Lincoln?

- 2.) Residential property owners in the City of Lincoln are faced this year with a total re-valuation of property by the Lancaster County Assessor's office. Early indications point to a potential double-digit increase in overall property values and subsequently, higher property tax revenue for all taxing authorities.
 - > Should the City of Lincoln adjust its levy to match previously budgeted revenues? Yes, the levy should be adjusted during the next budget cycle.
 - If the City of Lincoln were to leave the current levy rate in place, what should it do with the excess dollars?
 - The current levy should be lowered. I would vote against leaving it in place as it exist now. While there are competing interest for funding, I would like to focus on city department staffing and delivery of services. That includes police and fire department staffing issues.
